

Prosser Memorial Health will be at the 86th Annual Meeting to conduct a free health fair.


Members are eligible to receive a simple pulmonary function test, lipid panel, bone density screening, blood sugar test and blood pressure screening.

Huard Substation Now Energized

Benton Rural Electric Association (REA) celebrated the completion of a new substation located in Prosser, WA.

Huard substation, located at 24835 N Hinzerling Road, was built on land purchased several years ago for future expansion. The project was completed in phases beginning in 2022. The addition of Benton REA's 20th substation was needed to improve reliability of electricity served to its members.

"Huard substation will not only allow us to provide redundancy, but also increases the capacity for growth in the surrounding areas," says Derek Miller, Engineering Manager. "It was also designed with space for further expansion in future years as our service territory sees more growth."

Huard substation underwent testing in the month of April and was connected to Bonneville Power Association 115kV line. It was fully energized and brought online in May. ■
